## 2024 President's Report:

This year the board endeavoured to put in place people and activities to help give our business community support in the ways they best need it. We were able to hire Darlin as our Membership Services and Marketing Coordinator to start a number of good initiatives including The Faces of Impact social media profiles, newsletters, and a freshening up of the VIC. Though we still have quite a bit to do in refining the day-to-day activities of how we best support our membership, we have made some good steps and we are excited to continue on that path.

## A few of the things we have been working on:

- We worked with Nova Scotia Tourism to bring the Compelling Tourism Communities Initiative to Baddeck this winter to generate marketable content and interest in our 4 seasons offerings.
- We combed through our current bylaws, examined other similar documents of other organizations and have proposed changes to modernize our society.
- We spent significant time rebuilding the team at the VIC as through the pandemic, we were left without a single returning staff member.
